Policy Update

Term Length Project

Senators Jeanette White (D-Windham) and Bill Doyle (R-Washington), who lead the Senate Government Operations Committee, have committed to take a hard look at whether Vermont should keep its two-year election cycle or enact a four-year term for the governor and other officials. Two proposals have been introduced with half the Senate signed on as sponsors. The committee is planning deliberations for January 2008 to allow time for Vermont citizens to join the debate and help to shape the outcome.
